The change in climate of shopping for books, through the internet and people shopping at wholesalers has made the task of the Bookshop all the more difficult.

I thank Annette for making this tough decision. After much prayer, consultation and exploring many different avenues to redeem the possibility of continuing, Annette circulated the following:

It is with great sadness that I must announce that the Kiama Christian Bookshop will cease trading at the end of October 2010. It has been a great witness to Kiama and the surrounding region for over 30 years however due to continually decreasing sales it is no longer viable, and the decision has been made to close.

The date of closure will be the 22nd or 29th October, to be announced closer to the time.

There will be a Thanksgiving Morning Tea for all people who have had an association with the shop as a past employee or customer over the last 30 years. The date for this is yet to be finalized, but it would be encouraging to have as many people as possible come and give the shop a fond farewell.

Over the next few weeks please talk to the staff and thank them for their faithful service, some of whom have been there for over 20 years. It is a difficult time for all the staff, so please pray that they will find another outlet for their skills and time.

Orders will not be taken after the end of September, however we will have the final daily reading notes for the year for those who order them. Commitments for bookstalls will attempt to be kept until closure.

Senior Minister writes



CHURCH IN COMMUNITY

The time approaching Christmas is often a time when our hearts and our thoughts are turned toward those in the community who are yet to know Christ's love. At Christmas, the Church opens its doors to bring the message of hope to the world. It has me thinking, why is this not what we do and who we are 24/7, 365 days a year?

As I reflect on the year past, and the intention of the V.I.P., I see two objectives, Objective #5 Gainsborough Community Connection, and Objective #7 Community Service Initiative with an intention of connecting with the community.

As I reflect on who we are, the people of Kiama Anglican Churches, I survey an array of people well connected within this vibrant community.

As I reflect on Kiama Anglican Churches and the Kiama community I see a vast gulf. The temptation is to say that, the gulf is the gospel. It is, but we cannot blame or hide behind the gospel. The gulf is created by ourselves and our heart for the community. We must be living out the gospel in the community, bridging the gulf by how we live and our lives.

I was challenged at a recent seminar about the church and its place in the community that, "When the church becomes the Church the community will partner with us" was what the keynote speaker said. What does that mean?

Firstly, I see that it means that the Bible is a book for life, not just a book for the church. If we imbibe the Bible's teaching without a heart for the community, for those who need to know it the most, then we are gorging ourselves feeding on it, whilst those all around us are starving for it's truth. We must see the Bible as a life-guide for us not being the church in the community but becoming the church in the community. As church, we are preaching what we are becoming. My intention as your Senior Minister is to preach us into the community. I pray that God will lead and guide us to become this 24/7, 365 days a year.

Secondly, I see that it means that faith is for the big things outside the church. The promise of salvation is not so that we get saved so that we can sing about it for the rest of our days inside the church. Charles Wesley got it right when he said that, "the world is my parish". It was the Methodist movement that seeded the way forward for the modern church: work, save, give away. Wesley turned the church inside out, directing its responsibilities to be primarily about the community it is called to serve. That community is not primarily the church itself!

Thirdly, I see that it means that church must stop being for us and start being

for them. There is a saying that, "a man wrapped up in himself makes a small parcel." If our church is wrapped up in itself we remain a small parcel and not the greatest gift of Christ's saving love that we are called to be in our community. If we keep our view of church as an inward focus then the question we face is, "where does God go on Mondays?" Most of our community are asking the reverse question, "where is God everyday?" as they have not found Him in churches. We are called to be Christ-like, to be the salt of the earth, not the salt of the church.

Our message, our programs, the very essence of our life as a church must be, "other-centred". Our message, the gospel is not about Christian tradition but about Christian conviction. I am convicted that what I must be about as your Senior Minister is to reach out, to serve our community. We have the Book, the Faith and the church to do just that. How can we not be a church that is about and for our community.

The only problem that I see with our vision, our V.I.P. is that 2 of our 12 objectives emphasise the community. This can make us compartmentalise our responsibility to the community as a church. When I read Jesus, I read that He did not say just love Christians, His call was to love all people. Jesus did not say worship me, He said follow me. I take it that means we must follow the example of Jesus' call to love all people. Let's love the community as Christ loves us, not with a measure, a 2 of 12 type response.

Friends, let's respond to our community with a renewed 24/7, 365 day response of Christ-like love and service. My sense is that the pureness of our motives will set the clarity of our vision. My prayer and my hope is that our vision, our V.I.P. will renew, excite, guide our focus as a church, as we become a church visible to and in the community, then the community will partner with us.

called, "Grace and Strength – Strong in the Grace that is in Christ Jesus." Greg Holmes writes;

"It is the early 60s AD and Paul is once again in prison in Rome. When we studied Philippians he was also in Rome in prison but it would appear he was released, as he hoped, and was able to continue ministry. Now he has been arrested again and to the best of our understanding he will only leave prison on this occasion to be taken out and beheaded.

Timothy, Paul's friend, associate and protégé, is a young church leader in the bustling cosmopolitan port of Ephesus where in Acts 19 Paul had had a hand in establishing a growing church. Paul had written the church a letter, Ephesians, reminding them of what God had done for them by grace and encouraging them to live lives worthy of the gospel and stand strong in the faith. Now Timothy leads this maturing Church.

Paul has written an earlier letter and now writes again to Timothy, the elder apostle to the younger disciple and church leader. His message is one of encouragement and challenge, of love and support, of truth and warning.

This letter however is not merely for one Church Leader in one town nearly 2000 years ago. Our Lord God through His Holy Spirit has seen fit to preserve this letter to guide, encourage and challenge us as we too seek to live as followers of the Lord Jesus Christ. It is my prayer that through the study of these 4 brief chapters we will all grow in our relationship to our Lord, to our church and to one another."

As December commences and Christmas is upon us we delve into Luke's gospel and investigate, "The Songs of Christmas: Mary, Zechariah, Birth of Jesus, the Angels and John the Baptist."

Luke 1:46-3:6

With the prophetic words of Micah in our hearts and minds, we come to the place of the promised ruler for God's people – the stable at Bethlehem. We come alongside Mary, Jesus' expectant mother; Zechariah, Jesus' spirit-filled Uncle; those at Jesus' stable, the shepherds and the angels; and John the Baptist – the people whose voices echoed songs of joy, fulfillment, promise, truth and peace as they sang of Jesus Christ, God's Son.

Christmas reminds us of the path of the Son, and John's song from Isaiah 40, prepares us to follow God's promised ruler into the New Year and beyond. May the year ahead be full of the joy that these songs of Christmas bring.

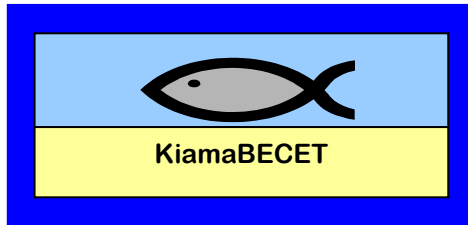
KBECEC GERRINGONG FUND RAISER.

August 19th saw the NSW POLICE BAND perform in Gerringong Town Hall. The concert was a huge success. The band played a wide variety of musical pieces from a Michael Jackson bracket from the 21st Century back to the big band sounds of the 1930's and 1940's as well as everything in between. The lead vocalist, a serving female police officer proved to be a thoroughly professional entertainer. The audience both young and old were mesmerized by her vocal renditions. The NSW Police Band do not charge for these performances and the Board are especially grateful for the Governments generosity. The concert raised some \$2000 for KBECEC and Gerringong Uniting Church are to be thanked for putting on this now bi-annual event.

BUDGET MATTERS.

The annual budget for this ministry at Kiama High is some \$62000. In 2010 Churches who are affiliated with the Board provided \$12500, Fund raising events by affiliated churches raised some \$12500 and individuals donated some \$25000.

The excess of expenditure over income is approximately \$10000.

Another group have met to discuss training. This is progressing. Have requested a list of training courses available from Youth Works.

Objective 10 – Funding

Jim, Sue, Richard & Bruce met to discuss ways of raising funds. Agreed to: upgrade Rummage Sale, have a cello & piano concert at Pavilion, run a pie drive and have a Christmas Celebration dinner with Children's pantomime and carols.

Rummage Sale has been upgraded to

include a family friendly Fair with jumping castle, putting & quoits comp., balloons, lucky dips, sausage sizzle and craft shop.

Objective 11 – Communications

First team meeting held 17th August to discuss and agree on operating protocols and priorities.

10.00am pre-service advertising slides developed to welcome visitors and tell them and the congregation about upcoming events.

Currently developing the Ministry Facility Upgrade presentation.

Church Website being updated for a planned launch.
